Travel to Iceland

- 1. You must get a PCR test with a negative result, no more than 72 hours of your departure to Iceland. Travelers with valid proof of vaccination or prior Covid infection are exempt from this requirement.
- 2. You must complete an online pre-registration form before arrival which shows:
 - a. Contact Information
 - b. Confirmation of a negative PCR test result, proof of a valid vaccination or prior Covid infection.
 - c. Address for their time spent in Iceland, and:
 - d. A declaration of health.
- 3. When you arrive in Iceland you must take and pass a PCR test.
 - a. If the result is positive, you must go immediately to a "vaccine" hotel approved by the Icelandic Government. Your stay will be free of cost.
 - b. You may take subsequent tests if you believe the result to be inaccurate.
 - c. Those who do not present a vaccination certificate or a certificate of previous infection at the border must quarantine for five days and go for another test at the end of quarantine.
- 4. Within 72 hours prior to your departure for the United States you must go to an Icelandic Health Center for a PCR test. Prior to going to the Health Center you must go online to the <u>Covid.is</u> website and schedule an appointment at least 24 hours prior to departure.
- 5. Children born after 2005 are tested at the border. They are exempt from the obligation to present a negative PCR certificate upon arrival. If a child travels with a person who is required to be quarantined, the child stays with them and is released from quarantine if the second test from the companion is negative. If the companion is exempt from double screening and quarantine, so is the child. A child travelling alone must be quarantined until a negative result is obtained from border testing.
- The PCR test taken in Iceland prior to your return to the US should cost approximately 80 EU
